Kokosing Nature Preserve - The Kokosing Nature Preserve is a conservation burial ground located in the picturesque countryside of Gambier, Ohio. A project of the Philander Chase Conservancy, Kenyon College's land trust, the preserve offers a natural burial option on twenty-three acres of restored prairies and woodlands.

Natural burials are a growing trend but hearken back to a centuries-old tradition. In a natural burial, the deceased are not embalmed and caskets are not placed inside underground metal or concrete vaults. Rather, the deceased are placed in shrouds or biodegradable caskets, typically made of wood or other natural materials. Graves can be marked by natural, engraved stones that lie flat and are typically fewer than three inches above the ground. The Kokosing Nature Preserve is the first conservation burial ground in the nation to be affiliated with a college or university land conservancy. The Green Burial Council believes cemeteries, preserves, and burial grounds can broadly be considered green if they meet the following criteria: caring for the dead with minimal environmental impact that aids in the conservation of natural resources, reduction of carbon emissions, protection of worker health, and the restoration and/or preservation of habitat. Green burial necessitates the use of non-toxic and biodegradable materials, such as caskets, shrouds, and urns.

Opportunity Knox - Styrofoam Recycling Machine: Opportunity Knox is an employment center and is a county government One-Stop resource center for residents to access all the tools, training and connections needed to gain self sufficiency. In 2016, they received Community Grant funding to purchase a Styrofoam Recycling machine and became one of a few counties in Ohio that began accepting Styrofoam. DKMM Solid Waste District, which is also a non-profit organization offered their support to this project because it met their mission statement, "To manage the District's current and long-term solid waste disposal needs in an environmentally responsible and cost-effective manner while reducing reliance on landfills by implementing waste reduction, reuse, and recycling strategies. You will see a live demonstration on how Styrofoam is converted into a reusable commodity and prepared for shipping. (Speaker: William Arnal, Supervisor)
